The Tribal State Gaming Compact has been scheduled for a hearing before the legislation Committee on April 17, 2024. Tribal council are in hopes that the legislative committee will approve the compact before the summer recess occurs. Once The Secretary Of The State receives the approved compact, the compact will then be submitted to the Department of Interior in Washington D.C. Central Office of Indian Gaming and Solicitors office for review. The Assistant Secretary of Indian Affairs will then execute signature on the compact. The Work Force Development crew has been doing some wood clearing out on the Auberry "Airport" property. Both of them are tribal members too which makes it twice as exciting. Why is Groundwater Important to Humans

Contaminated groundwater can make people sick. Water infrastructure requires regular maintenance. Groundwater sometimes contains naturally present germs and harmful chemicals from the environment, such as arsenic and radon. More often, however, human activities contaminate ground water.

The United States uses 82.3 billion gallons per day of fresh groundwater for public supply, private supply, irrigation, livestock, manufacturing, mining, thermoelectric power, and other purposes.

The most common method to access groundwater is by drilling wells into the aquifer systems. Rainwater seeps through the earth into these systems, resulting in natural, clean groundwater

A roll off will be available all week at the transfer station, all items need to be put inside of the roll off bin. Do not leave items next to the to the roll off. Items that cannot be dumped; motor oil, flammable liquids.

What is Composting?

Composting is the natural process of recycling organic matter, such as leaves and food, scraps, into a valuable fertilizer that can enrich soil and plants. Composting simply speeds up the process by providing and ideal environment for bacteria, fungi, and other decomposing organisms (such as worms sowbugs, and nematodes) to do their work in your composting pile.

Why Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

It helps sustain the environment for future generations. Reduces the amount of waste that will need to be recycled or sent to landfills and incinerators. Allows products to be used to their fullest extent. It also saves landfill space by keeping useful materials out.





Your appointment must be made and verified with the CAP department <u>Before</u> your spot can be reserved for the transportation services. Schedule appointments <u>ONLY WITH SAIGE RILEY</u> 24 Hours prior for local transports and 1 week in advance for Fresno transports.

The transporter will wait 15 minutes after your scheduled departure. If you do not arrive on time, your appointment will be canceled and can be rescheduled <u>with Saige Riley</u> <u>only</u>. There are new rules for the transportation services, please call the transporter for a copy of revised rules. Transportation services are for Big Sandy Rancheria Tribal Members. The transporter cannot transport kids to school that have missed the bus. All CVIH appointments are to be scheduled with CVIH transporter. If the CVIH transporter is unable to transport you, they will need to reschedule your appointment. This applies to all medical, dental, nutrition & referral appointments. *ATTENTION ALL TRANSPORTATION PARTICIPANTS* Big Sandy Rancheria will be requiring updated signatures for transportation rules and regulations.
